After 17 long and hard years, our old principal, Mr Hunt has left Churchlands Senior High School to take up a Director position at the Department of Education. As much as we are excited for him at his new role in such an important position, it is always sad to see someone we respect or consider a close friend leave. That is why in this article we shall take a trip through memory lane of the achievements of Mr Hunt as a tribute to his years of service for the school.

Achievements

Mr Hunt's dedication to communication and leadership within the school has resulted in both academic and community successes. For example, Mr Hunt introduced our House Coordinator structure into the school, we are so fortunate to be a school that has four House Co's per year group.

Mr Hunt also introduced the Churchlands Art of Teaching program for teachers at Churchlands to develop teaching skills and in 2011 established Churchlands as an Independent Public School.

Under his leadership, the Churchlands Foundation was launched in 2014, a financial program to manage future planning and ensure the future of the school was secured. Mr Hunt has been the solid backbone of the school for almost two decades, a period in which a great deal of new infrastructure was introduced to accommodate for the exponential growth in the student and staff population, with Churchlands now being the largest single campus school in the state.

Community friendships

When asked about things enjoyed during Mr Hunt's position as the principal, a Year 8 responded that they "loved having free dress days and heaps of charity driven activities at school". Throughout the years, the school has participated in many fund-raisers to help benefit charities such as the Red Cross and the Salvation Army, Radio Lollipop and World Vision where students either participated in a free dress day with a gold coin donation or donated canned food or clothing.

A strong friendship has continued with our sister school Akashi Nishi, even being gifted a cherry blossom tree in 2016. Through this friendship, students would host 2nd-year students from Japan and every two years, lucky students would get to tour Japan, spending 10 days hosted by an Akashi Nishi student.

We, the students would like to say thank you for your hard work


