Local charities working with CSHS

Churchlands SHS works with many local charities through the school year and most of these are managed by Ms Christina Kolodij, the Community Service Coordinator.

Whilst not held this year, CSHS normally sends over 150 students to the 'Relay for Life' at Challenge Stadium which raises money for the Cancer Council. Students must continually walk laps over a 24 hour period to raise money which goes towards looking after people undergoing treatment for cancer, those that have overcome it as well as those who care for people with cancer. It is a very popular event for students who love coming together and sometimes staying up all night for a great cause.

Since the beginning of term two CSHS has been working with the Salvation Army in a "Community Partnership Project".

The focus is "Knitting for Charity" and students have embraced the challenge to learn to knit to help those less fortunate. The initiative has gained great momentum with 216 students registering to knit squares which collectively will produce a blanket. At the end of term two, CSHS was able to pass on 10 completed blankets to the Salvation Army and six completed scarves with hats.

Through the persistence and hard work of our wonderful students, there are people in crisis who are now much warmer and looking much more colourful.

World Vision, Lions Club, Rotary and PCYC are other charities that the school supports. Gold coin donations collected through Free Dress Days and Sausage Sizzles are donated as decided by the Student Council. You will also find CSHS student volunteers at the weekly Rotary Farmers Markets in Stirling.

Last but not least are our large number of students who belong to Surf Life Saving Clubs in WA. Students contribute 100's of volunteer hours patrolling the beaches during Summer. They assist in keeping the public safe whilst swimming or spending time at our beautiful beaches which are arguably the best in the world.

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Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines (2019)*.

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information.
